THE FIRST BAHA'I CENTENARY, AND CONVENTION FOR YEAR 101.

The Centenary programme will be issued separately, and the Convention programme will appear in the Baha'i Journal. About midnight on the night of May 22nd/23rd will be held the devotional meeting colebrating the Declaration of the Bab, which commemorates the actual moment of the Centenary. The Guardian has particularly stressed the importance of this meeting and has asked all believers to attend it.

Convention is from Saturday, May 20th to Monday, May 22nd. The London community is providing tea on Sunday and Monday afternoons, and supper on Saturday and Sunday evenings, besides being responsible for the feast at the midnight Centenary Commemoration. In addition, refreshments are being provided at some of the meetings in a public hall during the Centenary week.

The Food authorities will not allow anything extra for all this and we are therefore entirely dependent on our own resources. We ask for your co-operation. The main needs will be tea, sugar, powdered milk, tinned meat or fish, tinned soups, cakes and biscuits or the materials to make them, lemon and orange squash, etc. The help of all will be welcome. In order that the people responsible may know how much food they need to purchase, friends are asked to advise the secretary of the London Spiritual Assembly at least a fortnight before Convention starts.

Friends are reminded that very few will be able to get home after the night meeting on May 22nd - only those within walking distance can do so. It is therefore advisable to bring a rug, as one may feel chilly if trying to sleep afterwards.

RIDVÁN. The Twelfth Day of Ridván is being celebrated on Tuesday, May 2nd, at 7.0.p.m. It will be preceded at 6.20 p.m. by a menorial meeting for Mr. Shetji N.R. Vakil, the late chairman of the Indian National Spiritual Assembly.

The Ridván programme will consist of a narrative concerning Bahá'u'lláh with readings from the Bahá'í Writings. Please invite all your friends. Visitors may also attend the memorial meeting if they wish it. Contributions in kind to the feast are requested.

(The memorial meeting is being held on this date because it is the first anniversary of Mr. Vakil's death. It has not been possible to hold the memorial meeting before this.)
