PROGRESS OF THE SIX-YEAR PLAN

Work in the five goal-towns: Birmingham, Leeds, Liverpool, Northampton and Nottingham, chosen to attain assembly status by next April, is vigorously pursued by the National Teaching Committee and the local believers. Northampton has already more than the necessary nine to form an assembly, but two of the believers may move to another goaltown. Leeds has seven believers. Birmingham and Nottingham have five each. Liverpool has three.

In the four other goal-towns: Altrincham, Blackburn Blackpool and St. Ives, too, teaching work is steadily going on. At St. Ives the local believers, with the help of visiting teachers, held an exhibition and an outdoors meeting by the quayside, in July. The quayside meeting drew big crowds, with some vehement opposition.

Una Townshend, whom we were very happy to have with us in London for some months, has pioneered in Dublin. We pray that her efforts be crowned with glorious success.

Very soon a chart indicating the progress of the SIX-YEAR PLAN will be on permanent exhibition at the Centre.
