CONVENTION AND THE SIX-YEAR PLAN.

Convention, which was hold in Birmingham this year on April 26th & 27th, was pouneated by the consciousness, in the minds of all present, that we had achieved our goal for the year which has been so often described by our beloved Guardian as "crucial", and constituting a landmark in British Baha'i History". It was attended by about 75 Baha'is and a few non-believers. A reception was given by the newly-formed Birmingham Assembly on the evening preceding the opening to all the friends and a large number of visitors. The Baha'i speakers included Hasan Balyuzi and Mrs. Slade, and the Baha'i Exhibition was on view. A brief discussion was followed by refreshments. It was a highly successful evening from the teaching point of view as about 90 of the 130 people who attended were enquirers.

The new N.S.A. was elected on the Saturday evening, some delegates voting by post and some others by telephone, as many of those who were working were unable to arrive in time. Results were announced as follows:-

A cable was sent to the Guardian and messages to Marion Hofnan and Una Towsnhend.

Reports were made by all the National Committees - Teaching, Youth, Publishing Trust, Summer School, Journal, Scripts, Archives, Child Education, Reviewing and Study Course. Paramount among these was, of course, that of the N.T.C. dealing with the progress of the Six-Year Plan.

The Guardian had given us three tasks for the year:
to establish assemblies in the five most promising Goal
Towns, form nuclei in Scotland and Ireland, and reestablish the assemblies in Bournemouth and Torquay.
Northampton, the first Goal Town to achieve nine
nembers, did so in October. Birmingham and Nottingham in
January, and Leeds in April. The number in Blackburn was
achieved at the last ninute by the transfer of Walter
Wilkins there from Birmingham. Mrs. Slad had also gone
to Blackburn but a new declaration in the town enabled
her to return to London. The fact that this measure was
resorted to shows how determined was the N.T.C., and
there who supported it, that this year's target should
be achieved at all costs. As was stated at the transfer
the importance does not attach to enrolling nine new
believers but to the establishment of an assembly on
new territory. With the completion of the other tasks
as well, the target for the year just ended has been
achieved, with a safety margin of ONL believer. Twentytwo pioneers have arisen during the year, including
five from London:—Sheila Vorrall, Valter Wilkins,
Robert Cheek, Dick Backwell and Miss Faxter — bringing
the total of London's pioneers to seven. We have thus
provided, as we should do, more pioneers than any other
town in the country, and our nembers have fallen to 88,
making us now only the second largest British Baha'i
Community. No amount of success, however, gives a
reason for complacency, and in stating our contribution
we do not suggest that we have done our share, since
the tasks given to us by the Guardian will increase with
each milestone we achieve, as his letters frequently
show; and the report of the N.T.C. was concerned as
much with the future as the past. much with the future as the past.

Four Goal Towns have been selected for this year:
Liverpool, Blackpool, Edinburgh and Bristol. In these
towns we do not start with the same advantages of resident
believers as we did last year, and the Secretary
stated that this year's goals would require a greater
effort. The Committee has also decided to strengthen
the nuclei already formed - only shortly before ogg
Convention - in Dublin and Cardiff, and to establish
teachers, of which the Convention magnifed it who had fell
or pairs of teachers) in Lewcastle, Oxford, Freter,
St. Ives and a town in Northern Ireland. This year's
budget is estimated at £4,000, as against £3,474 Test
year. Much of the money is spent on financing pioneers
and travelling speakers. No financial source ovas and
mentioned as being likely to provide this sun, but
confidence was expressed that it would be found. One
of the more dramatic incidents of Convention occurred
later with the anouncement of an amonymous wift of
£100 to the Fund.

This year's teaching programme requires at least

This year's teaching programme requires at least 25 new pioneers before Ridwan next year, and 44 believers on new territory, either pioneers or newly-declared Baha'is. The call to the larger communities, like ours, is obvious, for very few of those who have so far gone to pioneer are free to move again, since a community which allows its members to fall below the required nine members would lose assembly status and throw away a gain already made; nor can other voting members leave the new assemblies to pioneer for the same reason.

In conclusion, we would like to pass on to those who were not present a recommendation made at Convention that we should, from time to time, re-read our Guardian's letters about the Six-Year Plan.
