Dear Baha'i Friends, On behalf of the N.S.A. I am asked to say that the difficulties which your Community faces are a matter of deep concern to the National Assembly. We know how depleted are the ranks of your active workers, and how overburdened those who continually serve. The National Assembly has real sympathy with you.

We feel that you should be proud of your contribution to the Six-Year Plan, and never let the present difficulties obscure your bright future. You are still the largest Community in the British Isles, if not in numbers, certainly in the measure of your contribution to National work. The Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer of the National Spiritual Assembly, and one other member, all come from London, as well as the Chairman of the National Teaching Committee.
