A new chapter in the history of the London Community may be opening. Following a recommendation of the delegates at Convention that local Communities adopt goal towns, the London Assembly has chosen Brighton for concentrated attention by the London Community. We now have a special responsibility for the work in Brighton as well as our continuing responsibility to contribute in every way possible to the activity in other towns of the Plan.

This method of forming assemblies, which is new to the British Isles, has proved highly successful in many parts of the Bahá'i World. If we exert ourselves, perhaps we can make Brighton the first of many spiritual daughters of the London Bahá'i Community.

To achieve this a truly united effort from all members of the Community will be needed. Here are some of the important things you can do to help:

Provide Brighton pioneers with contacts. Send names and addresses of people who could be invited to meetings to Miss A.E. Baxter, 45 Tisbury Road, Hove. Could you pay an extended visit to Brighton to make new contacts?

Support Brighton meetings in person. If you are able occasionally to attend meetings in Brighton, let one of the Secretaries of the London Assembly know. It is of value for Baha'is to be present at a meeting in a Goal Town even if they do not themselves give the talk, for this adds life to the meetings.

Pray for the work in Brighton. When praying for the general success of the Six Year Plan, add another specially for the work in Brighton. Everybody can do this one!

<u>Give books to the Brighton Baha'i Library</u>. Maybe you have spare Baha'i books you could give, or would like to add to your contributions to the National and Local Funds by buying books for it.

Pioneering and Teaching in Brighton. Pioneers and teachers are needed there no less than in other goal towns. It is possible to live in Brighton and work in London.

We should all maintain throughout the year a personal interest in what is done in Brighton, so a paragraph on the work there will be published each month in the Bulletin. This is a great opportunity for the London friends to prove their devotion to the Cause of God. What are <u>you</u> going to do to help? Any member of the London Assembly will be happy to answer your queries.
