Beloved Friends,

The second European Teaching Conference was held in Brussels from August 5th to 7th. Vivian Isenthal and David Hofman represented the British Baha'i Community. Your Spiritual Assembly asked Vivian Isenthal to write an account of the Conference for the Bulletin. Here it is:

Ours is a world community - how often have we read and heard those words, - but do we <u>realize</u> what they mean? No, it isn't easy, any more than really understanding what trillions or even billions, are. Only when one gets the chance to be present at some International Baha'i gathering, is the significance of the words brought home to one, as a breath-taking, glorious reality.

Such was the experience shared with my heretofore unknown brothers and sisters, at Brussels, at the Second European Teaching Conference - believers who came from the ten goal countries of the Plan given to the Americans by the Guardian, - Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland, Spain, Portugal, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Italy, Switzerland. All these countries have been opened up to the Faith of Baha'u'llah in the last two years. There were also visitors from U.S., Canada, Australia, England, Germany, France, and Persians staying in Geneva, and Indonesians from Amsterdam.

On the evening we arrived, before the start of the Conference, the Brussels Baha'is welcomed those of us who dropped in at their beautiful Centre, with cookies and excellent coffee or tea. Most of them could speak English far better than I could speak French, and English was used as the official language of the Conference, and translated where necessary. But at each session, the opening and ending prayers were read in three or four languages. As we all lived in the University hostel, it was like a summer school, and many delightful friendships were formed.

A public meeting was held on the Friday evening, in a beautiful hall in town, packed with an attentive audience overflowing right into the corridor, and the speakers were Lucienne Migette of Paris, speaking in French, and John Robarts of Canada, speaking English. At the close of the Saturday sessions, films were shown. One was of the previous year's Conference in Geneva, and the other was taken in America in 1912, on the occasion of the Master's visit there, and was very moving. Signor Giachery, who is in charge of the preparation and despatch to Haifa of the marble for the Shrine of the Báb, showed some most interesting slides of this work being carried out, in Italy.

The conference closed on the Sunday, with a coach tour of the town, and a wonderful Unity Banquet held in a large restaurant in town, at which the emotions of love and unity were very intense, as a delegate from each country gave a parting message of faith and love. An Italian believer said "By their fruits ye shall know them'. Let us see what fruits each one can produce by the time we meet again, next year."

Would that the peoples of the world could see how the World Order of Baha'u'llah forges ahead steadily, on a foundation of love, while their statesmen fumble and falter in their attempts at building on a foundation of selfishness! And to me, the conference has given a wider vision, and a deepened understanding of the great privilege of being a follower of the Baha'i Faith.
