LONDON TEACHING COMMITTEE

A Special Meeting will be held on Tuesday, August 7th, at the home of Mrs. Slade, 129 Ebury Street, S.W.1. at 7.30 p.m. to meet Professor and Mrs. Bishop Brown of U.S.A. These friends are now travelling in Europe and will spend a few days in London. Last year they represented the Bahá'i World Community at one of the U.N.O. Conferences for inter-governmental organisations. All Bahá'is are invited to come and bring their contacts.

Thursday evening Meetings at the Centre. It has been decided after all to continue these meetings during August and they will take place as usual every Thursday at 7.30 p.m. The theme for August will be "The Promised Day is Come".

A New Kind of Meeting. We start a new innovation in September. To meet requests from believers for Sunday meetings, we shall start a series of Devotional Meetings. These will be held on the first Sunday in every month and will be combined with a social occasion for the friends to meet one another. Programme Cards announcing the time of Thursday meetings, and the address of the Centre, are now available at the Centre. These are intended for wide distribution. They are the size of a visiting card, so can be slipped in letters, left inside a library book, etc. Please take a supply and make good use of them.

Contacts. One of London's primary needs is many more contacts. For a city of such size, our list is pathetically small and there must be many more people who would be glad to know of the Faith. We must find them. Many ways can and have been suggested from time to time, such as going to various society meetings, advertising in local papers, putting a notice outside a newsagents. We can try all these in our various districts and we can think of more. We appeal to all the London friends to devote half an hour each week, either alone or with one or two other Baha'i friends, to considering how they can introduce the Cause to fresh people.

Firesides. Are you planning to have a fireside in the autumn? Now is the time to be thinking about it, so that you can start off quickly in September.

Public Libraries. Has your local public library any Bahá'i books? Will you investigate and see if they have. If they have not, we suggest you ask the librarian if he would not like to have one and tell him where they may be obtained. Or if there is only a comparatively old book, maybe they would like a more up-todate book as well. And when everyone has dealt with their local library, they could perhaps try some of the adjacent ones; most London boroughs have a good many branch libraries.
