Professor Zeine Here the Spiritual Assembly shares with you a letter recently received from Professor Zeine: "I would like to thank you heartily for the very kind letter of 4th October which you wrote to me on behalf of the Spiritual Assembly of the Baha'is of London. Please convey to the Spiritual Assembly my deepest appreciation for their generous sentiments towards me.

"If I were in any way of service to the British Bahá'i Community during my stay amongst them this past year, I am most grateful to Bahá'u'lláh for that privilege. The days which I spent in London and in other towns and cities of the British Isles, surrounded by the friendship and love of the Friends, were days of rich blessedness and deep happiness. Their remembrance has now become the joy and treasure of my heart. My consolation at present is the certainty that while bodily I am hundreds of miles far from you all, spiritually I am more united with you that ever before. Please remember me in your prayers. With loving greetings, Yours joyfully in our Beloved Guardian's service."

On leaving England last month, Prof. Zeine left these four thoughts with us:

(1) The friends are "the chosen recipients and the privileged trustees of a divinely conceived Plan." Shoghi Effendi, March 29, 1951. (2) "Time is running short. The effort required to discharge the manifold responsibilities now challenging the members of a lion-hearted community is truly colossal. The issues at stake, demanding every ounce of their energy, and incomparably glorious. An ominous international situation emphasizes the challenge and reinforces the urgency of these issues."

Shoghi Effendi, March 29, 1951. (3) Joy: "Each one of you must be attracted and enkindled. Each one must be happy, for he has heard the call of the Kingdom... My spirit communicates with you. It annihilates time and space. God willing, the confirmations of the Supreme Concourse shall descend upon you uninterruptedly."

'Abdu'l-Bahá. (Tablet to the British Believers). (4) "Have full assurance that love is the divine aspect of God; that love is spiritual grace; that love is the Tight of the Kingdom; that love is the cause of the manifestation of truth in the material world." 'Abdu'l-Bahá.
