COME TO THE NINETEEN DAY FEAST - II

What is the Nineteen Day Feast? Firstly, it is not our equivalent of a church service, not just a time for community worship? It has been called by 'Abdu'l-Baha, the fulfilment of the Lord's Supper. It is in its entirety, in the fullest sense of the words, holy communion. Not, as in Christendom, "to show the Lord's death till He come," but to meet together, in the awareness that He has come, as the foundation of that Kingdom on Earth which He has brought. Its purpose is, in the words of 'Abdu'l-Baha': ".... so that people may gather together and outwardly show fellowship and love, that the Divine mysteries may be disclosed".

Therefore we commune with God and one another in the three aspects of our lives: firstly, worship of God. In this part of the Feast we pray and read devotional passages from the pens of the Bab, Baha'u'llah and the Master. This is a special devotional meeting, unlike the services in the Mashriqu'l-Adhkár it does not usually include readings from other Scriptures, nor instructional writings of the Baha'i Scriptures - just prayers, meditations and devotions. Then we give our minds to the news and work of the Cause of God throughout the world and in London. This should be a most valuable period when problems and hopes and ideas flow freely between the L.S.A. and the Community. Lastly, the social part of the Feast when, unconfined by regulated consultation, we may get to know one another as people and rejoice in one another's company, so developing that love and unity which are the life of our souls and will cause us to grow in the knowledge of God.

Thus the divine mysteries will indeed be disclosed and the bewildered people of the world will be irresistibly attracted to our midst.
