

CHANGE OF ADDRESS and BAHA'I CREDENTIALS

Once again the Assembly wishes to impress on the Bahá'í friends that they should communicate their change of address to L.S.A. Secretary promptly. Because of the failure of two Bahá'ís in adhering to this important rule, the Bulletins and other Bahá'í literature sent to them were returned by the postal authorities. Consequently it was presumed that they had left the country and they were not kept on the list of British Bahá'ís. When they came to a 19 Day Feast after a lapse of about six months, and did not produce their credentials, as prescribed by the National Assembly, they could not be permitted to attend the Feast. With our growing strength and the need for safeguarding our Bahá'í interests, it is essential that certain rules should be laid down by the competent Bahá'í administration. More important is the co-operation of the Bahá'í friends in willingly obeying these rules.
