I Bahá'í Centre Meetings Committee

- i (a) To organise programmes for the regular public meetings on Thursdays at the Bahá'í Centre, using as speakers only names from the list approved by the Assembly.
- i (b) Keep in contact with the Regional Teaching Committees so as to include details of meetings organised by them in their areas on the public meeting card.
- ii To organise informal coffee evenings on Mondays at the Centre according to the procedure approved by the Assembly.
- iii To organise devotional programmes and attend to other relevant items (such as food, flowers, etc.) for the celebration of the Bahá'í Holy Days at the Centre.
- iv To explore the possibility of organising a suitable function at the Centre during the week-end on a regular or periodic basis for the Bahá'ís and/or Bahá'ís and non-Bahá'ís, and seek the approval of the Assembly for the final arrangements.

To submit to the Assembly an estimated budget of expenses likely to be incurred in the above directed Terms, for consideration.

Mrs. Rose Jones and Miss Cissie Le Gray have kindly agreed to continue the good work they have done in the past of distributing the public meeting cards. Bahá'í friends wanting non-Bahá'ís to receive these cards regularly should send the names and addresses to Rose Jones.

Children's Committee II

VII Area Teaching Committees

It was agreed to appoint 6 Area Teaching Committees, to be known as follows: i Central London Teaching Cttee. ii South West London Teaching Cttee. iii South East London Teaching Cttee. iv North London Teaching Cttee. v North East London Teaching Cttee. vi West London Teaching Cttee.

On 23rd May, Newington Green Unitarian Church presented readings from various Holy Scriptures. Philip Hinton read three Bahá'í prayers. There were about 15 nationalities represented and the gathering of about 50 people showed keen interest in the Bahá'í Faith. Those Bahá'í friends who supported this meeting and after it was over met and discussed the Faith with others, should be congratulated on their efforts.
