MAGNIFICENT FUTURE

Normally dissolution of an Assembly in the Bahá'í world is a sad incident, but not so for the London Assembly. London was the first to have a Bahá'í Assembly in the British Isles. During its roughly half-a-century's existence, London Assembly has played a significant role in the affairs of the Faith. London has supplied many pioneers to many parts of this country. Now it has grown so large that it should be 're-born' in many assemblies in various London Boroughs as directed by the Universal House of Justice.

National Assembly has now approved the establishment of Local Assemblies in the following Boroughs:

- (I) Please do not move out of the nine Boroughs listed above without first consulting the Assembly.
- (II) Please explore the possibility of pioneering into the Boroughs of Croydon, Harringay and Hounslow.
- (III) If you can pioneer outside the Borough you live in, please let the Assembly know.
