The function of the co-ordinates would be:

- (i) to contact all the Baha's resident in their respective boroughs;
- (ii) to arrange for their periodic meetings:
- (iii) to plan ways and means of teaching the Faith locally in consultation with the borough friends, and
- (iv) to act as convenors for the election of local Borough Assemblies as and when advised by the National Assembly.

It is anticipated that new Borough Assemblies will be formed in at least nine boroughs - Barnet, Brent, Camden, Croydon, Ealing, Harringey, Kensington & Chelsea, Westminster and Wandsworth.

It is also hoped that pioneers would move into the Boroughs of Hammersmith,

Lambeth, Hounslow and Richmond-upon-Thames, to help the formation of four additional Assemblies. We need only twelve pioneers to make these Assemblies. Volunteers should contact L.S.A. and the co-ordinators of the boroughs concerned immediately.

It is important for all believers to note that on 21st April 1966, a number of meetings will be organized in different boroughs. Friends should attend the meeting of the borough in which they live. Election of an Assembly should take place on the 21st April only and your presence at the appropriate meeting is essential, if you have not voted by post.
