At the Conference of Living Religions within the British Empire, which is to take place &t the Wembley Exhibition, it has been arranged that the Bahai Message is to be presented on September 26th. All the Friends are active in endeavouring to use this opportunity for the Glory of God and the good of humanity. Owing to interest felt by the Friends in every region of the world in the progress of the Cause at the Wembley Conference, the Committee of Correspondence will endeavour to include in its next letter all authentic information.

The visits of Mrs. Maxwell, and Mr. F. Schopflocher of Canada mentioned in the last Circular letter have been the source of much inspiration and stimulus to the Friends.

The recent visitors have been Monsieur and Mdme. Dreyfus-Barney, who in their short stay gave most interesting addresses and laid great emphasis on the fact that the Spirit of Baha'u'llah is affecting the ideals of the different progressive movements now working towards unity and peace.

Mrs. Schopflocher passed through London on her way to Canada, and brought the Friends the happiness of hearing of her work in the far East and of her contact with the boundless activity of Miss Martha Root, and of the readiness of the souls everywhere to receive the Message of Baha'u'llah.

All the Friends in England unite in reverent love and sympathy for the persecuted in Khorassan, especially for the relatives of that blessed soul, Sheikh Abdul Medjid, whose blood has been shed in the Path of this Divine Cause.
