Dozza & Brisighella Experience

Enjoy this wonderful experience in the south of Romagna. Visit the medieval village of Brisighella with its towers and fortress. Savour a typical lunch at a winery estate with wine tasting. Visit an olive oil producer and taste the fresh-made olive oil. After lunch, immerse yourself in the unspoiled beauty and atmosphere of the medieval village of Dozza, with its colourful open-air frescoes, narrow streets, gentle slopes, and majestic medieval castle. If you have enough energy, climb the castle's towers, and enjoy a breathtaking view over this uncontaminated landscape! Enter the castle cellars and discover the region's most outstanding permanent exhibition of wines: over 1000 labels!

This is the perfect tour to give you insights into Bologna's traditions and culture. Discover Bologna's most famous monuments: Piazza Maggiore with the Accursio Palace seat of Bologna city hall since the XIV century, the Neptune Fountain considered one of the most elegant Renaissance fountains in Italy, St. Petronio Basilica with its treasures, the Archiginnasio Palace, first permanent seat of the oldest university in the world-famous for its frescoed walls and its Anatomy Theater, the Two Towers, St. Stephens Sq., and more!

Explore one of Bologna's oldest food markets with an insider and visit the most traditional food shops; the smells and tastes ensure the memories stay with you. At the Quadrilatero, Bologna Food Market, you will be offered 5 authentic tastings (a big meal) at a diversity of places: an ancient family-run Deli-store, a bakery, a chocolate factory, a pasta workshop, and a gelato shop.

Ravenna experience

Ravenna was once one of the most important cities in the western world. The last capital of the Roman Empire in the West, it subsequently became the capital of the Gothic kingdoms of Italy and of Byzantine Italy. The early Christian Byzantine mosaics in Ravenna are the finest in the world. Ravenna is a European "superstar" city which attracts visitors from the four corners of the world thanks to its unparalleled Byzantine mosaics with complex allegorical meanings. You will be guided through the Mausoleum of Galla Placida, with the earliest mosaic scheme in Ravenna, San Vitale's Basilica, the Neonian Baptistery with superlative early Christian mosaics, and St. Apollinare Nuovo. You will learn the secrets of ancient mosaic techniques in a relaxed yet stimulating atmosphere at a mosaic workshop. You'll have the opportunity to create something special to take home

and hang on the wall as a memory of Ravenna, made with your

hands.


