This issue will feature projects and articles that are all about using, adding to, and improving your stash, whether that means adding specialty art yarns or workhorse staples.

March/April - "National Parks and Museums"

September/October – "Cut and Sew"

This issue will be all about weaving and using handwoven cloth for creating garments, bags, belts, pillows, and anything else you can think of that would be even more special if made from fabric from your loom. Send us your projects and articles that embrace the power of cutting and sewing with handwovens.

November/December - "Exploring the Ifs"

"As ifs" refer to those times when a weaver decides to weave a threading using another structure's treadling, and the "what ifs" occur when weavers decide to throw caution to the wind and experiment in ways that are new, or at least new to them. Articles should expound on the theme of exploration in weaving and new approaches to the craft.
