OUR BRONX YOUTH CENTER (BYC) OFFERS:



EDUCATION SERVICES

Our education programs for young adults includes academic instruction, college application and transition assistance, paid internship opportunities, work readiness instruction as well as job placement.



TRAIN & EARN

Train and Earn is a sector-based program with work readiness and training workshops that runs for 4 weeks. Training opportunities include: EMT, IT, security guard, pharmacy technician, computer and network service technician and more.



ADVANCE & EARN PLUS

Advance & Earn Plus offers paid academic instruction and internship opportunities for young people seeking to obtain their high school equivalency diploma.



ADVANCE & EARN: WOODLAWN

Our 20-week training program offers a 10-week paid internship, MetroCards for transportation, certifications, (OSHA, Site Safety, Manlift, and more), incentives for benchmarks throughout the program, and job placement assistance.



SUPPORTIVE SERVICES

Our supportive services include The Academy program for foster care youth, parenting support, Bronx Youth Council, housing and supportive benefits, crisis management, and more.

A NEW BRONX YOUTH CENTER SPACE

Through the BYC, The Door provides critical career and education programming to over 600 young people per year—including targeted support for systems-involved youth, and young parents. Since opening in the South Bronx in 2015, the BYC has served as a safety net and gateway to career advancement for young people living and working in one of New York City’s most under-resourced communities.

In June 2023, the BYC officially relocated to a newly renovated 18,000 square foot space on Third Avenue and 154th Street in the Bronx. The new location and increased space will enable The Door to provide additional programming that more closely replicates the full suite of offerings at the SoHo location. Under this more holistic approach, The Door will be better equipped to ensure that more young people in the Bronx have access to the tools, resources, and opportunities needed to overcome obstacles and succeed in adulthood.



BYC IS EXPANDING SERVICES TO INCLUDE:

- Full on-site membership
- Free basic needs, including hygiene kits, baby supplies, and clothing
- Food and nutrition programming
- Post-secondary education support
- Foster care
- Housing support
- Legal services
- Mental health services
- Arts programming
