Anton is an Associate Principal at RBB Economics and is based in London. He has been advising on a wide range of economic issues in competition and regulation policy since 2015. His expertise in competition economics includes antitrust investigations, private enforcement litigations, market studies and mergers, including horizontal and vertical issues.

Anton has extensive expertise in antitrust investigations, including abuse of dominant position, information exchange and cartels. He has experience advising the subjects of such investigations as well as the authorities conducting them.

He has advised on numerous follow-on and stand-alone litigations, preparing economic and econometric evidence on the likelihood and quantum of damages, pass-on and other matters for the proceedings before the Competition Appeal Tribunal (CAT) in the UK and several local courts across the rest of Europe.

On mergers, Anton has worked on the cases before the European Commission, the UK's Competition and Market Authority and competition authorities in Brazil, India, Russia, Singapore, Turkey and others.

In making economic arguments, he supports theory and business facts with data-based insights. He stays up-to-speed with advancements in econometrics, including interpretable machine learning models - Anton was among the first to implement a Nobel Prize winner's methodology of such a model and pioneer its use on a competition case.

His sectoral experience covers semiconductor memory, heavy trucks, rail transport, cars, payment processing, online search and advertising, statutory audit, healthcare, social care and telecoms infrastructure.

Anton holds an MSc in Economics from the London School of Economics and a first class honours BSc in Economics from the University of Warwick. He has also completed several professional courses on advancements in competition economics, including from the Toulouse and Barcelona Schools of Economics. Anton is fluent in English and Russian.
