Directive 2011/65/UE “RoHS III” & following Commission Delegated Restriction to use certain hazardous substances in electric and electronic equipment (AEE)

Following up the Directives in object, C.matic S.p.A. declares that its products are intended to be assembled into other equipment in order to perform their own function and that NONE of them fall under the application field of the Directive 2011/65/UE (RoHS II) and following Commission Delegated Directive.

However, in consideration of the bans and restrictions determined by the RoHS and Delegated Directives, with regards to some substances deemed dangerous for health inside the electric and electronic equipment, and with a view to supplying an analysis tool to their customers, C.matic S.p.A. have made an accurate study of the materials used during the production process of their products and are able to declare with regards to such hazardous substances as follows:

Lead (Pb): in consideration of all exemptions stated at the paragraph 6 of the Attachment n°3 of the Directive 2011/65/UE and in consideration of the new Commission Delegated Directive of the 1st March 2018 and of the 31th March 2015, any component made in brass, steel and aluminium used by C.matic S.p.A. in all supplied products do show a level of lead within the limits determined by the Directives if assembled in AEE equipment falling in Classes 9 & 11 (exemption term 21/07/2024).

Mercury (Hg), Cadmium (Cd), Hexavalent Chromium (Cr 6+): these substances are not present in any products supplied by C.matic S.p.A.

Polybrominated Biphenyls (PBB), Polybrominated diphenyl Ethers (PBDE), Bis(2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP), Butyl benzyl phthalate (BBP), Dibutyl phthalate (DBP), Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP): any plastic component used by C.matic S.p.A. were declared free of these substances.
