## TRADITIONAL OWNERS TO WELCOME TRAVELLERS

CANBERRA AIRPORT BECOMES THE FIRST AUSTRALIAN AIRPORT TO INTRODUCE AN AUDIO WELCOME TO COUNTRY

Visitors arriving at the International Terminal of Canberra Airport will now be greeted by a Welcome to Country in Ngunnawal, the traditional Aboriginal language of the ACT region. Recorded by Ngunnawal Traditional Owners, it also features an introduction and translation in English. It's the first audio greeting of its kind for any airport in Australia.

For Ngunnawal Traditional Owner, Caroline Hughes, the Canberra Airport initiative is an important recognition of Ngunnawal culture, reconciliation and a source of personal pride.

"Our language is the key to all our relationships and how we interact with each other. Growing up, we could never share our language with non-Indigenous people. Language was to be kept secret, to keep us safe. They took children away if you spoke language," Ms Hughes said. "So to come full circle where we can share that with all Australians and visitors from overseas, I am so proud and honoured."

2019 is the UNESCO International Year of Indigenous Languages, and it's a time of increased interest in the revitalisation of the Ngunnawal language. Canberra Airport hopes the unique greeting in Ngunnawal, will connect visitors with the long, continuing Aboriginal history of the ACT region and enrich their stay.

# CEOS TRY TO STEM THE GROWING HOMELESS PROBLEM IN OUR AREA

\$800.000 RAISED FOR CANBERRANS IN NEED

Canberra Airport was proud to host the 10th annual Vinnies CEO sleepout on 20 June to raise money for the St Vincent de Paul Society which supports Canberrans in need.

Temperatures dropped to -5 while more than 180 CEOs learned firsthand what Canberrans experience as they sleep rough.

Since 2011, the number of rough sleepers in Canberra has doubled, and 30% of people seeking homeless services are now children. The number of older women seeking help has also gone up, by 18%.

The Canberra Vinnies CEO sleepout raised a record \$800,000, that will support the Canberra local community and will create positive improvement in people's lives. The money will go to help Canberrans who can't afford the basics – food, education, utilities and even a place to call home.

CAPITAL BREWING CO. BAR IS JUST ONE LOCAL PARTNERSHIP BEING CREATED

Canberra Airport is excited to announce a new and exciting range of specialty stores and restaurants opening from late 2019.

The new retail offering will feature the best, locally-sourced products from Canberra and the region and will include an extensive upgrade of food and beverage options, including the addition of a 'Capital Brewing Co. Bar' in partnership with the beloved Fyshwick-based brewery.

With this addition of more than 1,000 sqm of new retail, Australian airport food and beverage company, Airport Retail Enterprises (ARE), will develop the food and beverage component of the new terminal retail.

Stores will be introduced in two stages, with the construction of stage one finishing by the end of this year and stage two being completed by Easter 2020.

### PUSH TO **RAISE NEWSTART**

AT \$40 A DAY, THERE ARE CONCERNS THAT NEWSTART IS NOT HELPING PEOPLE FIND A JOB AND BREAK THE CYCLE OF POVERTY

After sleeping outside at the Vinnies CEO Sleepout, Stephen Byron, CEO of Canberra Airport and a Director of The Snow Foundation, is calling on the Australian Government to "Raise the Rate" and make Newstart work for people who fall on tough times as they look for work.

"Part of the Sleepout was a roleplay that showed what it is like to live on the Newstart benefit and how easy it is to fall behind and lose hope. It was very eye-opening," says Stephen Byron, CEO of Canberra Airport and a Director of The Snow Foundation. "I want to formally call on the Government to raise the rate of Newstart to meet the real living expenses of people who need help while seeking work."

Newstart payments are about \$40 a day and have not been increased in "real" terms for 25 years. The Australian Council of Social Service has suggested an increase of \$75 per week.
