CAPITAL EXPRESS CONNECTS CANBERRA TO THE WORLD

SINGAPORE AIRLINES BRINGS DIRECT INTERNATIONAL FLIGHTS TO CANBERRA

Singapore Airlines will be the first international airline to operate regular international flights from Canberra starting September.

The new Capital Express route will provide two direct international destination options with flight SQ292/291 operating Canberra-Singapore and Canberra-Wellington.

Singapore Airlines CEO, Mr Goh Choon Phong, said the new service linking Singapore, Canberra and Wellington reflects the close ties between the three countries.

"We are excited about the prospects for our new 'Capital Express' route, which we are confident will appeal to leisure, government and corporate travellers," he said.

"We are especially pleased to be bringing more convenient travel options to customers with Canberra's first regularly scheduled international flights and the first non-stop links between the capitals of Australia and New Zealand."

Since it was purchased in 1998 Capital Airport Group has invested more than \$2 billion in facilities at Canberra Airport, investments that

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will help it make history on 21 September when it welcomes the first Singapore Airlines flight.

Canberra Airport Chairman, Mr Terry Snow AM, said the decision by Singapore Airlines to begin operations was justification of the long-term vision that Canberra Airport has had for many years.

"From day one, my family set about creating a world-class gateway for the national capital. As long-term locals committed to the prosperity of the capital region, our campaign to see Canberra become linked directly to the rest of the world has been constant," said Mr Snow.

"We have worked closely with the ACT Government and VisitCanberra, and particularly Chief Minister Andrew Barr, who over many years has been unwavering in his passion and support for our quest to gain direct international flights.

"I can think of no better partner than Singapore Airlines with its reputation for quality and excellence to be the first to set Canberra Airport on this historic course."



TAKE HEART WINS 9 AWARDS FOUNDATION



THE SNOW FOUNDATION HELPS INDIGENOUS CHILDREN THROUGH GLOBALLY RECOGNISED FILM

A documentary supported by the Snow Foundation on the plight of Indigenous children with Rheumatic Heart Disease (RHD) has won nine awards at the prestigious Global Independent Film Awards.

Take Heart: The Quest to Rid Australasia of Rheumatic Heart Disease is a communications initiative designed to educate at-risk communities and health professionals and elevate RHD as a public health priority. It comprises a one-hour feature film, 14 short films, an action toolkit, two smart phone apps, a website, social media, touring films and photography exhibitions.

An estimated 6000 Indigenous young people in northern Australia are living with rheumatic heart disease, or have had acute rheumatic fever which can cause fibrosis of heart valves, leading to crippling valvular heart disease, heart failure and death.

Snow Foundation CEO Georgina Byron said: "We supported Take Heart to help increase awareness of RHD.

"It is shocking to have this condition prevalent in Australia today, when it is 100% preventable through simple administration of penicillin, and we are proud to be helping communities, health professionals, researchers and government work together to address this disease."
