TENANTS JOIN FORCES WITH OZHARVEST

IT HAS BEEN JUST OVER THREE YEARS SINCE THE FOOD RESCUE CHARITY OZHARVEST HIT THE STREETS OF CANBERRA, AND IT HAS DELIVERED OVER 1,100,000 RESCUED MEALS.

Costco is the seventh tenant at Canberra Airport to become a food donor with Ozharvest and donated one of the single largest pickups this year following their grand opening in July; a whopping 825kg of food was collected!

AIRPORT SPONSORSMAJOR EXHIBITION

CANBERRA AIRPORT HAS COMMITTED ITSELF TO THE NATIONAL GALLERY OF AUSTRALIA, BECOMING A MAJOR EVENT SPONSOR FOR THE NEXT TWO YEARS.

The National Gallery of Australia officially announced its major summer exhibition on 2 September. Entitled "Renaissance - 15th & 16th Century Italian Paintings from the Accademia Carrara, Bergamo", the exhibition is Australia's first to be dedicated solely to paintings from the Renaissance period.

The exhibition will run from 9 December 2011 to 9 April 2012, featuring over 70 paintings, including works never before exhibited in Australia by Italian artists such as Raphael, Botticelli, Bellini, Titian and Mantegna.

The exhibition is a significant achievement for the National Gallery, and one that will generate major benefits for the ACT Tourism Industry.

LAYING THE FOUNDATION FOR CANBERRA'S GATEWAY

CONSTRUCTION OF THE SECOND STAGE OF CANBERRA AIRPORT'S NEW TERMINAL IS OFFICIALLY UNDERWAY WITH THE ACT CHIEF MINISTER KATY GALLAGHER LAYING THE FOUNDATION STONE ON 2 AUGUST 2011.

Signifying an important milestone in the "AirVolution" development project, the Western Concourse Terminal is estimated to be completed by mid-2013 bringing the total investment sum for the terminal project to \$420 million.

Praising the progress of the development, Canberra Airport Managing Director, Stephen Byron, noted that "for many visitors to Canberra, the first thing they see of the city is the Canberra Airport terminal. We need to show them that we are a city of innovation, industry and leadership".

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Mirroring the recently completed Southern Concourse and bringing the overall terminal size to 30,000 m², the Western Concourse Terminal will boast 12 additional check-in counters, 5 additional aerobridges, an indoor taxi rank, new airline lounges, a doubling of the current baggage handling capacity and passenger screening area as well as new food and beverage and retail offerings.

"From the very start of the bid process back in 1998 we made a promise to Canberra that we would transform the Airport and turn it into something remarkable. So far, we have made excellent progress with the completion of the Southern Concourse, and we will continue to build the best Airport we possibly can", Mr Byron noted.

Acting as a major employment driver for the ACT and surrounding region, the project will provide employment for 1,200 people over the course of construction, with 300 permanent, on-site jobs being created upon completion.

The second undercover car park is due for completion in April 2012 and the Terminal project is on track to be completed in time for the Centenary of Canberra in March 2013.

NEW SHUTTLE SERVICE **TO THE CITY**

THE NEW, DEDICATED AIRPORT SHUTTLE IS OPERATED BY RENOWNED TRANSPORT COMPANY ROYALE LIMOUSINES AND COMMENCED SERVICES ON SEPTEMBER 5, PROVIDING TRAVELLERS WITH A CONVENIENT TRANSPORT ALTERNATIVE FROM CANBERRA AIRPORT.

Initially operating in accordance with a set timetable, the Airport Express will offer ten return services on weekdays and six return services on weekends, transporting passengers between Canberra Airport and the City via Russell. However, with growth in mind, the company plans to offer on-demand, door-to-door services to and from major hotels and the Parliamentary Triangle from as early as November 2011.

Welcoming the addition of the shuttle service, Commercial Manager at Canberra Airport, Jeanette Hall, noted that "we are delighted to welcome the Airport Express as another way to assist passengers travelling to and from their flights. The company understand the needs of air travellers and recognises the unique profile of the Canberra passenger".
