

Hyaluronidase Pre and Post

Hyaluronidase is an enzyme which breaks down hyaluronic acid fillers. Although some of the effects can be immediate (within 24 to 48 hours), it can take up to 2 weeks for the results to be seen and the procedure may need to be repeated.

Hyaluronidase administration can result in anaphylaxis (a severe allergic reaction) which is life threatening and requires immediate medical attention. Symptoms of a severe allergic reaction can include shortness of breath, wheezing, coughing, difficulty swallowing, swelling of the tongue, eyelids, lips, hoarseness of the voice, stomach pain, nausea, or diarrhea.

If you have any of the above symptoms, please let your provider know and report to your nearest Emergency Department or call 911.

After the procedure some other common injection-related reactions might occur. These reactions include:

redness, swelling, pain, itching, bruising and tenderness at the injection site.

They have generally been described as mild to moderate and typically resolve spontaneously after a few days following your injection. Bruising may occasionally be more significant.
