



## Safety Notice – Load security

## Kia ora koutou,

We have recently been notified of three events where log trucks have either had a log about to fall off their load or the chains were so loose the logs were moving significantly with potential to fall off.

These reports have come from experienced logging personnel and in all cases, they took appropriate action by stopping the truck and notifying the driver.



These are serious events; please use them as learning opportunities and re-enforce your own and the industry's load security requirements and best practice across your transport and harvesting operations, including the drivers and loader operators.

Effective load security requires a fit for purpose log truck and trailer, an experienced loader operator and a truck driver committed to ensuring the load is secure when leaving the loading area and again prior to exit onto public/main roads and during the balance of the journey.
